

“Scripture Alone (Be Sure of Your Source)”

2 Peter 1:12-21

The turbulence and unrest brought about by the Reformation in the 1500s was caused by men who were determined to bring religious reform to the Church of Rome by teaching the pure truth of Scripture. These champions of biblical truth stirred up a storm with the most powerful dignitaries in all of Europe. As a consequence, they endured intense persecution. These men based all that they believed in on the Word of God -- the Scriptures. They were men who were sure of their source.

In our text, Peter exhorts Christians to go to the “true” source – the Word of God. Beginning in v. 12, he addresses the subject of “the” truth by discussing what it is and what it is not. He then provides us with three assurances concerning God’s truth – God’s Word.

I. God’s Word is the Sure Word (v. 19a).

II. God’s Word is the Authoritative Word (v. 19b-20).

III. God’s Word is the Inspired Word (v. 21).

Some final thoughts
